

Three escape serious injury after Narrikup small plane crash

A pilot and two passengers have escaped serious injury after their light aircraft crashed on Sunday afternoon.

The Cessna aircraft was landing onto a private airstrip in Narrikup, between Mount Barker and Albany, when a strong crosswind pushed the plane into trees about 1.45pm, police spokesman Sam Dinnison said.

The pilot and passengers were able to get out of the crashed plane, two of them with the assistance of St John Ambulance.
