

Planes collide on runway at Melbourne's Moorabbin Airport

Two light planes have collided on the runway at Melbourne's Moorabbin Airport in the city's south-east, the Metropolitan Fire Brigade (MFB) says.

Ambulance Victoria confirmed three people were injured in the incident.

The three, including a man and a woman aged in their twenties, were taken to hospital with minor injuries.

Ambulance Victoria Spokesman John Mullen said two other people were treated at the airport grounds.

"All five people at the scene were treated for shock," he said.

There are reports the planes collided as one made an emergency landing.

It is understood that plane issued a mayday call reporting engine troubles.

The second plane was taxiing on the runway when the collision occurred.

The MFB said both planes were badly damaged in the crash.

About 25 fire fighters are on the scene trying to contain fuel leaking from both aircraft.
