

Pilot escapes uninjured after making emergency landing on Davis Creek property

A CROPDUSTING pilot has escaped uninjured after being forced to make an emergency landing on a remote Hunter Valley property.

Emergency services were called to the Davis Creek property, north-east of Muswellbrook, about 11am on Tuesday.

A Westpac rescue helicopter spokesman said the plane was spreading super phosphate when the pilot had to make an emergency landing after experiencing engine failure.

“The plane has been damaged but thankfully the pilot has nil injuries as a result,” the spokesman said.

The aircraft involved was a PAC Cresco 08-600 single engine turboprop aircraft built in New Zealand. David Boundy, of Superair, said his Scone-based pilot was safe and well.
