



Light plane crash lands in WA bushland

A LIGHT plane has suffered technical difficulties while flying over WA's Wheatbelt, forcing the pilot to perform an emergency landing.

Two people were in the light aircraft, a 64-year-old pilot and a male passenger, also 64, when it crash landed at about 9.50am near River Tarn Road in Piesseville, about 211km south east of Perth.

The pilot and his passenger suffered minor injuries in the landing but were not trapped and were out of the aircraft before emergency services arrived at the scene.

Police from Wagin and Narrogin attended the scene, as well as St John Ambulance and Department of Fire and Emergency Services personnel.

The men were treated by paramedics and taken to Narrogin Hospital. The Australian Transport Safety Bureau (ATSB) have been advised of the incident.
