

Three dead after light plane crashes in paddock near Mount Gambier

Three people have died and another has been injured after a light aircraft crashed just north of Mount Gambier in South Australia's south-east.

The plane crashed into a paddock near the intersection of Walker and Sunnybrae roads, in Suttontown, just before 10:30am.

Early reports are that the wreckage of the aircraft was smouldering when emergency crews first arrived.

One person has been taken to hospital.

The Country Fire Service said the plane was extensively damaged.

Police said Major Crash and Australian Transport Safety Bureau (ATSB) investigators would head to the scene and assist in the investigation.

The ATSB said the plane was a TB10 Tobago.
