

# Light plane crashes at aerodrome north of Brisbane

**A light plane has crashed off a runway north of Brisbane early on Monday.**

Emergency services were called out to the Redcliffe Aerodrome just before 7am following reports a light plane had "come down", a police spokesman said.

The light aircraft "came down" at Redcliffe aerodrome on Monday morning, police said.

*The woman pilot, the sole occupant of the aircraft, was assessed by paramedics with "no obvious injuries" and transported to Redcliffe Hospital in a stable condition, an ambulance spokeswoman said.*

An Australian Transport and Safety Bureau spokesman said officers were gathering information about the incident to determine whether to start an investigation.

The aerodrome is owned, operated and managed by the Moreton Bay Regional Council and hosts more than 30 aviation businesses including pilot training, charter services, scenic flights and aircraft maintenance and refurbishing services
