Hello and Welcome to another Issue of the AirCentre News Flash from the Archerfield News Desk where aviation history is recorded for all those persons who fly-in, pilot or enjoy the ownership of light aircraft.

The first of the long awaited Cirrus SR20's is about to arrive in OZ.

The Cirrus aircraft is one of the most interesting and exciting commercially built machines to be seen in recent years and it's on its way to Archerfield!

The SR20 is a 4 seat single powered by a Continental 6 cyl. fuel injected engine of 200 hp that enables a cruise speed of 160kts. ...with the undercarriage down and welded!

....not a bad performance for the speed/horsepower combination considering the Dunlop's are still dangling!

It is of almost all composite construction, has the latest in glass multifunction navigation display with moving map and approach certified GPS, with the flight direction controlled by a side mounted yoke "stick" in lieu of the normal central control "wheel".

The expected arrival date for the Cirrus is this Sunday, June 25pm.

There is no guarantee on this date as there is the requirement for a customs clearance at Brisbane airport once the aircraft hits mainland Australia on it's ferry flight from the USA.

Shortly after arriving at Archerfield it is anticipated that the aircraft will be moved into the hangar at Sunland Aviation, building 15 on the southern side of the main terminal building.

If you are interested in having a look at an aircraft that has a parachute installed for emergency recovery, call into Sunland and make yourself known; the crew will be only too happy to show you around.
